care for children with special needs. A few years later, CSC saw the need to have its own school. Again, thanks to their generous supporters, CSC received the funds necessary to build the school.

Under the Healys' leadership and God's direction, CSC has grown to include four residences, a school, offices, and a medical facility, providing for 75-100 orphaned, abused and neglected children in Cebu City, Philippines. While residents at CSC, the children receive comprehensive services. encompassing nutritional, medical, educational, emotional, and spiritual needs, as provided by over 100 Filipino staff working hand in hand with American missionaries. These support staff include social workers, house parents, tutors, child care workers, household workers, guards, caretakers, and office staff.

Paul and Marlys are models of Christ's love in action. They dedicated the majority of their lives, serving as missionaries in the Philippines. CSC is so thankful for all they have done. With an amazing leadership team in Cebu, we will continue the work they started. We are excited to see what God does at CSC in the next 40 years. ■

The title of "hero" is overused. These days, there are superheroes and guitar heroes. But a true hero is rare. I believe Paul and Marlys are heroes. Their journey started years ago when no one thought of them that way. They, along with some others, took on the challenge of caring for children in need, knowing full well the future was uncertain.

When I was in seventh grade, my family and I visited the shelter. The heat, traffic, and bustle on the streets of Cebu overwhelmed me, but I vividly remember a physical calm filling me as we entered the green gates of Children's Shelter of Cebu. It was a haven. I met Jacob, the child my family supported, and all the kids. I also got to see the Healys and everyone at the shelter caring for and loving the children.

In a high school writing class I had to write about a hero. I thought back to the shelter and Marlys. After

reading the assignments, the teacher announced there were two papers that clearly defined a hero.

The first paper was written about Spiderman. The second was my paper on Marlys Healy. So, there were Spiderman and Marlys Healy, standing side by side—each a hero.

Much has changed at CSC over the years. Many children have come to the shelter. Some have returned to birth families. Many children have joined their forever family through adoption. And as children leave, new children come in, their lives forever changed.

Paul and Marlys did not go to the Philippines to be heroes. They simply followed God's lead to care for children. Along the way, they changed the lives of so many. Paul and Marlys are heroes to so many children.
